# Take the opportunity to become a Queensland police officer!



The Queensland Police Service offers a traineeship for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people called the Justice Entry Program (JEP).

JEP is one of the Service's recruitment and career development strategic priorities to encourage Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people into a career in policing.

The traineeship provides the education requirements for entry into the QPS as a police recruit. Trainees who successfully complete this program will receive a Certificate IV in Justice (Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander).

#### ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

To apply for the Justice Entry Program applicants must:

- be of Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander descent
- have either
  - passed Year 10 and completed three years of full-time work experience or

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- completed at least five years of full-time work experience
- hold life-related skills and experience that demonstrates potential to succeed as a police officer

Driving experience is also required. Applicants must hold:

- a current Open Driver Licence to operate a motor vehicle (manual or automatic) in Australia or
- a Provisional Driver Licence with at least six months of driving experience.

In addition applicants must meet police recruit entry requirements including health and fitness, integrity and residency.

ADDITIONAL DRIVING REQUIREMENT JEP trainees with a Provisional Driver Licence must pass the course Drive Vehicle in Queensland (TLIC107C) in their own time and at their own expense before entering the police recruit training program. ## DURATION

The JEP traineeship is a six-month, full-time course conducted at the Queensland Police Service Academy.

### SALARY

Trainees will receive an allowance equal to that of a police recruit. For existing employees of the Queensland Police Service, ordinary salary or wages will be maintained for the duration of the traineeship.
