The Keys to Careers Program will provide participants with a full driver's licence and employability skills to assist with gaining an apprenticeship or traineeship.

The program will be offered in **Gladstone**.

Participants will be equipped with job readiness and life skills as well as undertake accredited training for entering the workforce and industry connections.

The program will involve three stages.

Stage One: Job Readiness and Life Skills

Participants will receive the following job ready skills:

- Resumes
- Mock interviews
- Communication and team work
- Industry contacts
- Construction White Card
- First Aid
- Drivers Licence (P)

Participants will receive the following life skills:

- Healthy eating
- Health checks
- Mentor support
- Drug and alcohol testing

Stage Two: Accredited Training

Training for a career pathway leading into an apprenticeship or traineeship.

Stage Three: Job Search and Mentor Support

Connecting participants to apprenticeships and traineeships.

Eligibility Criteria

To participate in this program, you need to:

- Be Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander
- Be a local Gladstone resident
- Be able to obtain a Drivers Licence
- Be able to attend the entire course
- Hold a current Learner Licence (Desirable)
