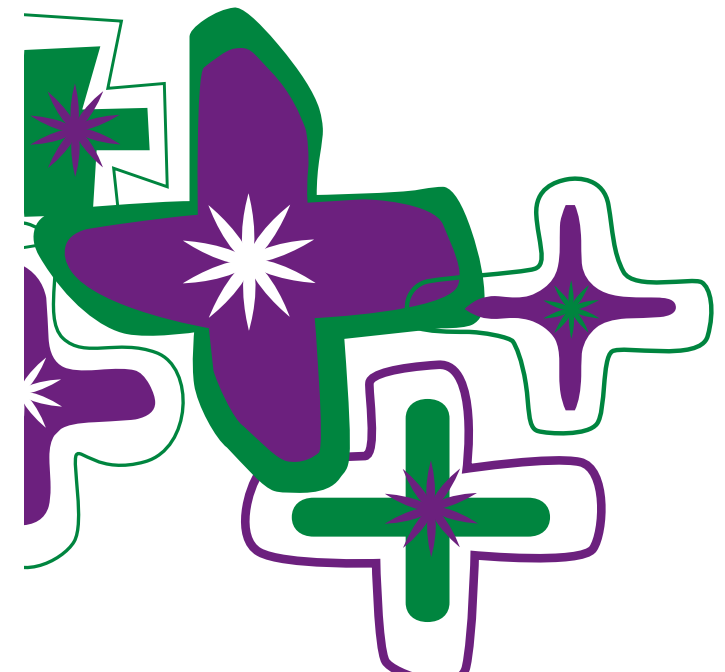

This course teaches adults how to assist adolescents who are experiencing a mental health crisis or developing a mental health problem.



What is Mental Health First Aid?

First aid is the help given to an injured person before medical treatment can be obtained. Mental Health First Aid (MHFA) is the help given to someone developing a mental health problem or in a mental health crisis. The first aid is given until appropriate professional treatment is received or until the crisis resolves.

What is the Youth Mental Health First Aid course?

The third edition Youth MHFA course is based on the international MHFA Guidelines. These guidelines were developed using consensus of mental health consumers, carers and professionals from English-speaking developed countries. Further information here:

Course Content

The Youth MHFA course teaches adults how to assist adolescents who are developing a mental health problem or in a mental health crisis.

Developing mental health problems covered:

- Depression
- Anxiety
- Eating Disorders
- Psychosis
- Substance misuse

Mental health crises covered:

- Suicidal thoughts and behaviours
- Non-suicidal self-injury
- Panic attacks
- Traumatic events
- Severe psychotic states
- Acute effects from alcohol or other drug misuse
- Aggressive behaviours

Participants will learn about adolescent development and the signs and symptoms of these mental health problems, where and how to get help and what sort of help has been shown by research to be effective.

Course Format

This is a 14-hour course. The delivery format is flexible.

Course participants receive a copy of the Youth MHFA Manual to keep and a Certificate of Completion.



About MHFA Australia

The MHFA Program was developed in 2001 by Betty Kitchener and Professor Tony Jorm whilst they were based at the Australian National University. It was then auspiced as a training and research program at Orygen Youth Health Research Centre, University of Melbourne from mid 2005. Since mid 2012 it has operated as a not-for-profit health promotion charity called Mental Health First Aid Australia.

The Program has been well evaluated and found to be effective in improving mental health literacy, reducing stigma and increasing helping behaviours. These evaluations have been carried out in workplace and community settings. Further information and links to MHFA related evaluations here:
