Terrence (Terry) Willmot is a descendent from the Wakka Wakka tribe and is a survivor from the stolen generation.

In 1971 Terry ranked No. 3 in the Australian Junior and Feather Weight Professional boxing arena and has spent most of his early life fighting to find his place in the world.

At the age of 57, Terry completed a Bachelor of Arts (Social work and Welfare) at CQUniversity, and although he has now retired he still has a passion with helping our youth and families in guiding them through decisions that can change their lifestyle pathways.



Ariane Anderson is a descendent of the Mamu people of Innisfail and Nywaigi of Ingam.

Ariane worked as a dental nurse and discovered she could achieve more and took the challenge to further her career and in enrolled into a university degree.

In 2014, Ariane was the first Indigenous student to graduate with a distinction in the Bachelor of Oral Health since the program has commenced at CQUniversity and has secured a position in the Oral Health Therapist Graduate Program. Ariane is now currently employed with Oral Services.
