Dr Pamela Croft-Warcaon is a Kooma clan descendent, of the Uralarui Nation, Yuwaalaraay language, South West Queensland.

Since the mid-eighties, Dr. Pamela has practiced as an independent visual artist producing artworks from her lived experience, guided by her Aboriginality, and training in both Aboriginal and Western traditional art forms. She is an academic who has worked extensively in Queensland and the Northern Territory, Australia and is currently working at the Office of Indigenous Engagement CQUniversity.



Terrence (Terry) Willmot is a descendent from the Wakka Wakka tribe and is a survivor from the stolen generation.

In 1971 Terry ranked No. 3 in the Australian Junior and Feather Weight Professional boxing arena and has spent most of his early life fighting to find his place in the world.

At the age of 57, Terry completed a Bachelor of Arts (Social work and Welfare) at CQUniversity, and although he has now retired he still has a passion with helping our youth and families in guiding them through decisions that can change their lifestyle pathways.
