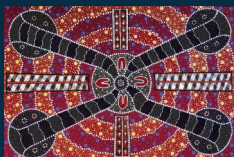


FREE Indigenous Autism Information Sessions



Helping Children with Autism Initiative Aboriginal & Torres Strait Islander Liaison Officer Program



The Helping Children with Autism (HCWA) package is an Australian Government initiative to improve the care and development of children with Autism in Australia.

The HCWA initiative includes supporting Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Liaison Officers who:

- Raise Awareness of Autism within Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander communities.
- Build relationships with Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander communities and link them with relevant support services.
- Provide Cultural Awareness training to Autism Advisors, Play Connect, Early Days and Panel Providers to improve their understanding of working with Aboriginal families and communities (these counts).
- Support Autism Advisors, Play Connect, Early Days and Panel Providers and assist them with community visits.



The Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Liaison Officer Program, in collaboration with Autism Queensland Association Ltd and Early Days, would like to give you the opportunity to participate in a free information session to learn more about Autism.

During this information session, you will learn:

- What is Autism?
- What are the signs to look for if you think a child has Autism. (communication, behaviour)
