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Introducing Central Queensland, Wide Bay, Sunshine Coast PHN

The PHN is a not for profit organisation which coordinates primary and preventive healthcare for the Central Queensland, Wide Bay and Sunshine Coast region. Primary health refers to the healthcare that takes place outside of a hospital, such as GPs, allied health, chronic disease management, aged care, mental health and Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander health.

Central Queensland, Wide Bay, Sunshine Coast PHN is one of 31 Commonwealth funded PHNs nationwide. The PHN identifies areas of need, such as lack of health care services, difficulty in accessing these services, or regions with particularly high health needs, and works closely with GPs, allied health care providers, hospitals and the broader community to ensure that patients can receive the right care in the right place at the right time.

Priority areas

While the PHN will focus on the health needs specific to the Central Queensland, Wide Bay and Sunshine Coast region, the Federal Government has set six key priority areas that will underpin all our planning and activities:

- Mental Health
- Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander health
- Population health
- Health workforce
- eHealth
- Aged Care

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
