The Public Guardian is an independent statutory officer (appointed under the *Public Guardian Act 2014*) who protects the rights and interests of vulnerable Queenslanders. This includes adults with impaired decision making capacity and children and young people who are in out-of-home care (foster care, kinship care) residential care, youth detention, mental health and correctional facilities.
